



Conference on **The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016** Analysis and Implications

24 February 2018 at 11:00 am at PHD House, New Delhi

The Budget 2018 has proposed two changes in the income tax law that was widely expected to be brought in to provide relief to the already beleaguered companies fighting to survive the insolvency and bankruptcy process under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016. It provides for reduction of aggregate of business loss and depreciation loss from the book profit of companies undergoing corporate insolvency resolution process while calculating minimum alternate tax (MAT) liability. While this is a welcome move, the larger expectation of the bidders for IBC companies was an unconditional waiver from MAT applicability.

Still, a year after introduction of IBC Code, it remains a work in progress. It has teething troubles and requires constants tweaks, as indeed all new laws do. Despite the recent amendments to the code and regulation changes by the IBBI, there are still several grey areas in the code which needs to be addressed by the regulators.
